- The City has been given the go ahead for the work on the Industrial railroad crossing and the bidding process is underway. This will be a major upgrade to the crossing plus the creation of a turning lane on the Old Highway for stacking.

- If a renter doesn't get rid of chickens within 30 days of being declared a nuisance, the owner will be cited to court
